



Machine Drawn Thread

This is very pretty on clothing and cloths. It works well on light-weight fabrics.

Method

1. Hoop 2 layers of water-soluble stabilizer and 1 layer of poly-cotton or any other light-weight fabric.



2. Stitch the Running-stitch outline using the same thread on the top and on the bobbin. I used white Marathon Thread.
3. The machine will stop. Using the sharp-pointed embroidery

Materials:

Hoop Size: 5inch x 7inch/130mm x 180mm

2 Layers Water-Soluble Stabilizer

1 Layer Poly-Cotton or other light-weight fabrics

Embroidery Scissors

Marathon threads according to Colour Chart

scissors carefully cut out the fabric inside the running-stitch outline. Do not cut the stabilizer underneath and do not cut any stitching outline.

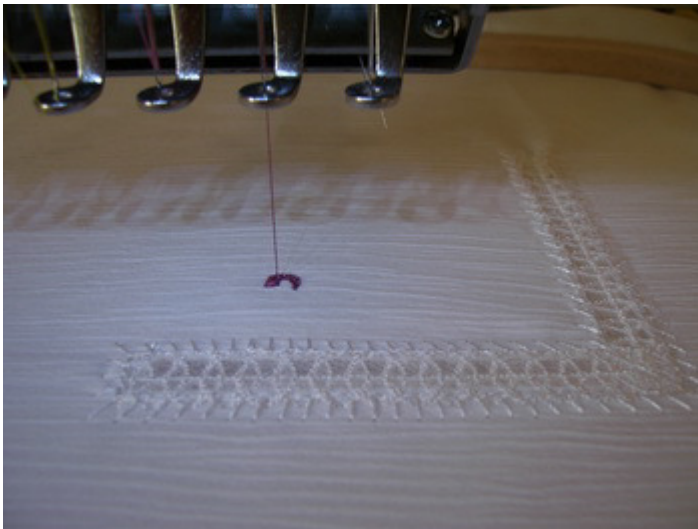


4. Now stitch the lacy embroidery- fill in this space. The embroidery thread and the bobbin must be of the same colour and thread for this. I used white as before.

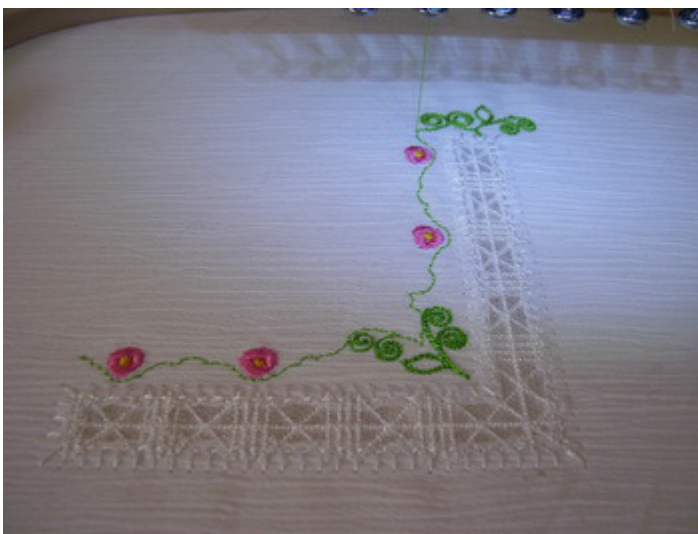




5. After this the machine will stitch a decorative outline around this shape. All this is done in white.



6. Now comes the floral design as shown. Follow your colour Chart to do this. Cut away any jump-stitches should they occur.



Continue changing colour as required.

6. When complete, carefully rinse away the stabilizer and lay flat to dry.
